Tuesday Morning

Text: Acts 13:13–41

Theme: The Story of Scripture Finds Its Fulfillment in Christ

Introduction:

In this synagogue sermon, Paul walks through Israel's history to show that the entire story of Scripture points to Jesus. Rather than presenting the gospel as a brand-new idea, Paul reveals it as the fulfillment of God's promises across generations. This passage helps us see how the Bible tells one unified story of redemption and challenges us to consider how our own lives fit into that larger story.

Discussion Questions

1. Why does Paul begin by retelling Israel's history before proclaiming Jesus? What does this teach us about how people understand the gospel? What is interesting to you about that?
2. What does this passage reveal about God's faithfulness throughout generations of human failure?
3. Paul emphasizes that forgiveness and justification come through Jesus rather than the law. Why would this have been both liberating and offensive to his audience?

4. In what ways do modern people still attempt to justify themselves through performance, morality, or identity?

5. What does this sermon teach us about how the Old Testament points forward to Christ?

6. How can understanding the "big story" of Scripture deepen our faith and confidence in the gospel?

7. How might this passage shape the way we explain the gospel to others today?

Text: Acts 14:1–18

Theme: The Human Heart's Tendency Toward Idolatry

Introduction:

After witnessing a miraculous healing, the people of Lystra assume Paul and Barnabas are gods in human form. Their response reveals something deeply human: we instinctively turn created things into objects of worship. This passage explores how easily people misunderstand God's work and how the gospel redirects worship from created things back to the Creator.

Discussion Questions

1. Why do the people of Lystra interpret the miracle through their existing beliefs about the gods?
2. What does this reveal about how culture shapes the way people interpret spiritual experiences?
3. Why are Paul and Barnabas so distressed when the crowd attempts to worship them?

4. How does Paul redirect the crowd's attention from themselves to the living God?

5. What modern forms of idolatry might function similarly to the worship of Zeus and Hermes?

6. Why do humans naturally look for something visible or tangible to worship? You might think about this in terms of, for example, when we paint or sculpt images of Jesus, we make Him to look like us. Perhaps think about it curiously, rather than conclusively.

7. How does the gospel free people from the cycle of creating and serving idols?

5. Why might the gospel provoke hostility or resistance in certain contexts?

6. What role does Scripture play in testing spiritual claims or teachings? (Hint: you can't answer "because it's inspired by God.") What is it about the truth of Scripture that gives it power over any other religious text or worldview?

7. How can believers cultivate both humility and discernment when seeking truth?

Theme: Faithfulness in Ordinary Life and Ministry

Introduction:

In Corinth, Paul's ministry unfolds not only in preaching but also in everyday work and relationships. He partners with Aquila and Priscilla, continues teaching despite opposition, and receives encouragement from the Lord during discouraging moments. The passage reminds us that God's mission often advances through ordinary faithfulness rather than dramatic events.

Discussion Questions

1. What does Paul's partnership with Aquila and Priscilla teach us about the importance of community in ministry?
2. Why might Paul have needed the encouragement God gives him in this passage?
3. What fears or discouragements commonly affect people who seek to share their faith today?

4. How does God's promise—"I have many people in this city"—encourage perseverance?

7. In what ways might God be calling believers to quiet faithfulness in their current circumstances?
